Philip Davis - Re Investigating Royal Marine's disappearance in Falklands

Dear members,

Just to bring you upto date, David Miller's book 'One of our Royal Marines is missing' was eventually, albeit reluctantly reviewed by the 'Penguin News' down in Stanley.

Early in the New Year, after posting a request regarding Marine Alan Addis on Royal Marine facebook sites, I was contacted by someone who alleged "that before Alan Addis went to North Arm settlement he was involved in an incident at a party somewhere in Stanley, in which Addis and two fellow marines from NP 8901 assaulted a young Falkland Islander".

No charges were brought by the local police, nor were they reprimanded to our knowledge by their detachment. Shortly after, Marine Addis went to North Arm settlement, where he disappeared (now presumed killed and his body disposed of).

It is believed that there was a relative of the young kelper who he allegedly assaulted, among the residents of North Arm, who may have had a motive for what subsequently happened to Addis.

This is just one line of our enquiries that we would like to clear up. We are not interested in who was responsible for Alan's death or for a prosecution over it. We just wish to recover his remains if possible and repatriate them back to the UK in line with his mother's last wishes before she passed away in 2011...
